"They all ate and were satisfied." We are a well-fed society, but we have a deeper hunger that we must identify and nourish. Saint Matthew, in his account of the multiplication of the loaves, borrows the language of the Last Supper to tell us how our hunger can be satisfied only in the Holy Eucharist: *Looking up to Heaven, He said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples.* The twelve baskets leftover stand as Saint Matthew's statement of God's perfect generosity and His ability to place more than earthly food into our stomachs. When we partake of the Holy Eucharist, we choose the banquet God offers us, a banquet in which every human need can be filled. We have a feast, initially humble enough with just bread and wine, but once consecrated as the Body and Blood of Christ, it can satisfy us like absolutely nothing else.

The Corporal Works of Mercy: *Clothe the Naked*

Definition: Everyone needs clothing for warmth, protection, modesty, and dignity. It is an act of love to help others obtain clothing, especially those who need help in meeting this basic human need.

Scriptural reference: Matthew 25:36

Applications: 1) Go through your drawers and closets and find good-condition clothes and shoes to donate to agencies that provide assistance for those in need.

2) In addition to donating gently used items, purchase some new items of clothing or shoes for the poor. For many of them, this may be the first time they possess such items. What a treat for them!

3) Participate in programs that provide blankets, quilts, towels, and linens for the poor. If you have a skill in quilting, consider starting a quilting club to provide quilts for the poor, especially families with children, and the elderly.

4) Volunteer to initiate or to work at a clothing drive where clothing can be distributed to those in need.

5) Instill in young men and women the virtue of modesty (prudence in attire), so that they may never become mere objects in the thoughts of others.

6) Offer an elderly or infirm neighbor or family member assistance in getting dressed if they have difficulties doing so on their own.

7) Assist the elderly or the infirm with their laundry.

8) Financially support charitable organizations that provide clothing for the needy, such as the Saint Vincent de Paul Society.

Looking Ahead

In a few weeks, the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In the Diocese of Bismarck, this solemnity is not a holy day of obligation this year, because it falls on a Saturday. The precept to attend Mass is abrogated or lifted. But for those who still want to celebrate the solemnity, we will have our usual 9:00 morning Mass at Sacred Heart on that day. Know that parishioners from all our parishes are welcome to join us in worship. *Our Lady, assumed into the glory of Heaven . . . pray for us.*

Rob Peter to Pay Paul

With the ongoing deliberation concerning the Sacred Heart parish rectory basement, the growing consensus is that we must bite the bullet and fix the concrete problems and in doing so, this will take care of the radon problem as well. The cost of removing and replacing the concrete, putting in a drainage field, and installing sump pumps is going to be quite costly. But there are other costs involved as well: installing an egress window for the removal of the old concrete and then bringing in the new concrete; removing sheetrock, paneling, closets, and cupboards for the drainage field around the perimeter of the rectory; the removal of the hot water baseboard radiator pipes so that the drainage field can be put into place and then reinstalling these radiator pipes when the drainage field is completed; the temporary removal of the hot water heater, the shower, and the toilet, again for the placement of the drainage field; and any electrical work that may be involved with this effort. These costs will add up, and they will be quite significant. The Women of Sacred Heart have generously offered about \$3,000 toward this effort, and another source of income could be the sale of the lot east of the parish center. I am not sure why this lot was purchased in the first place, because if there is ever a new rectory to be built, there is plenty of space on the church property, which occupies an entire city block. The lot is valued at just under \$10,000, but that sum would be a great help toward the rectory basement project. Please offer your feedback to me and your parish council members as we consider the sale of this lot. Thank you.
